## **WELIA HOSPITAL RADIO ROOM PROJECT NEARS COMPLETION!**

The new Radio Room Project at Welia Hospital in Mora is nearing completion with only a few equipment and furnishing items remaining to be installed.

The project was part of a recent and major upgrade to the hospital. When completed, Welia will house the best Amateur Radio communications capabilities of any medical facility in the region. As MORA Chairman Kenny Broshofske, KJ9W, stated in a letter presented to Welia Quality Manager Ellen Ryan during the MORA Christmas Party & Awards Banquet, it will “set the standard for other hospitals to follow.”

Broshofske’s letter was accompanied by MORA’s 2019 Public Service Award to Welia Hospital in recognition for its many years of supporting Amateur Radio and emergency communications.

The old Radio Room had been located on the second floor in a storage room, far from proximity to emergency conferencing. The new Radio Room has been relocated to the first floor of the hospital’s new Emergency Wing adjacent to a Conference Room - making it convenient to exchange messages during an emergency.

The Radio Room itself is very secure, and access to the room will be tightly controlled. The VHF/UHF Station is already operational, and on January 28<sup>th</sup> the Tuesday Evening MORANET originated from the hospital for the first time in several years.

## MORA UPDATES ARRL AFFILIATION STATUS

The Mora Open Repeater Association recently updated its affiliation status with the American Radio Relay League.

According to the latest membership report released on January 24th, MORA lists 29 Active Members, three of whom have not yet paid membership dues for 2020. MORA Membership Dues must be paid by no later than April 1<sup>st</sup> in order to be retained as Active Members.

21 of MORA's 29 active members belong to the ARRL, 4 of whom are Life Members.

2 of MORA's 29 active members have been awarded Honorary Life Memberships in the club.

Among currently active members, 10 are Amateur Extra Class, 2 hold Advance Class licenses, 8 are General Class, and 9 are Technicians. There are no Novice Class license holders in the club.

Also listed on the MORA register but not included in the update with ARRL are 6 inactive licensed members that have let their memberships lapse.

In Memorium, MORA lists 2 unto whom Honorary Silent Key status has been given: Father James Cashman, KCØEQE/SK, and Joan Fluegge, KCØBUT/SK.

The VHF/UHF Station was finished with the installation of computer equipment on February 4<sup>th</sup>. Scheduled uses for the VHF/UHF Station include the MORA Tuesday Evening Net on the fourth Tuesday of each month, as well as the Central Minnesota Regional Hospital Net on the first Wednesday of every month.

An HF Station with new coax feedline to a 75, 40, 20, 15 and 10 meter inverted vee antenna will be the final major equipment installation. Antenna installation will likely await warmer weather.

The HF Station will also be operated on a yet to be arranged schedule. Ideally, a schedule with other hospitals having HF capability should be arranged to assure the station is working as it should. Long range HF communications capability could potentially be important if a regional or national disaster were to occur.

“I’d like to see us scheduled to work W6VAH, for example” according to KJ9W. “A regular schedule with a VA Hospital on the West Coast would be a great test.”

Members of MORA will have an opportunity to see the new Radio Room during the HIPAA Training Meeting on Thursday April 23<sup>rd</sup>, with operator training beginning as soon as possible.

As the Welia Radio Room Project nears completion, MORA’s Chairman is hoping for completion of two other major and emergency related projects. The most important one is the long-awaited Hospital Net Link at Milaca. Another is the planned refurbishing of the Mobile Camper purchased last summer, which will give MORA a portable “on site” emergency capability.

“There’s a lot going on right now to be excited about,” Broshofske says.

### MORANET REPORT FOR 2019

The Mora Open Repeater Association Tuesday Evening Net enjoyed its most active year since 2009, but falling just short of 600 check-ins for 2019. The final tally of 594 check-ins was the most in the past ten years, 36 check-ins short of the Tuesday Evening Net record of 630 set back in 2009.

MORANET had 51 sessions during 2019, with an average of 11.65 check-ins per session. The highest number of check-ins was 17 on June 4<sup>th</sup>.

After bottoming out in 2014 with 451 check-ins, activity on the net has grown steadily. Since the Tuesday Evening Net began in 2006, there has been a total of 6655 check-ins, with an average of 10.43 check-ins per session.

# MORA SKYWARN NET TRAINING MARCH 12TH

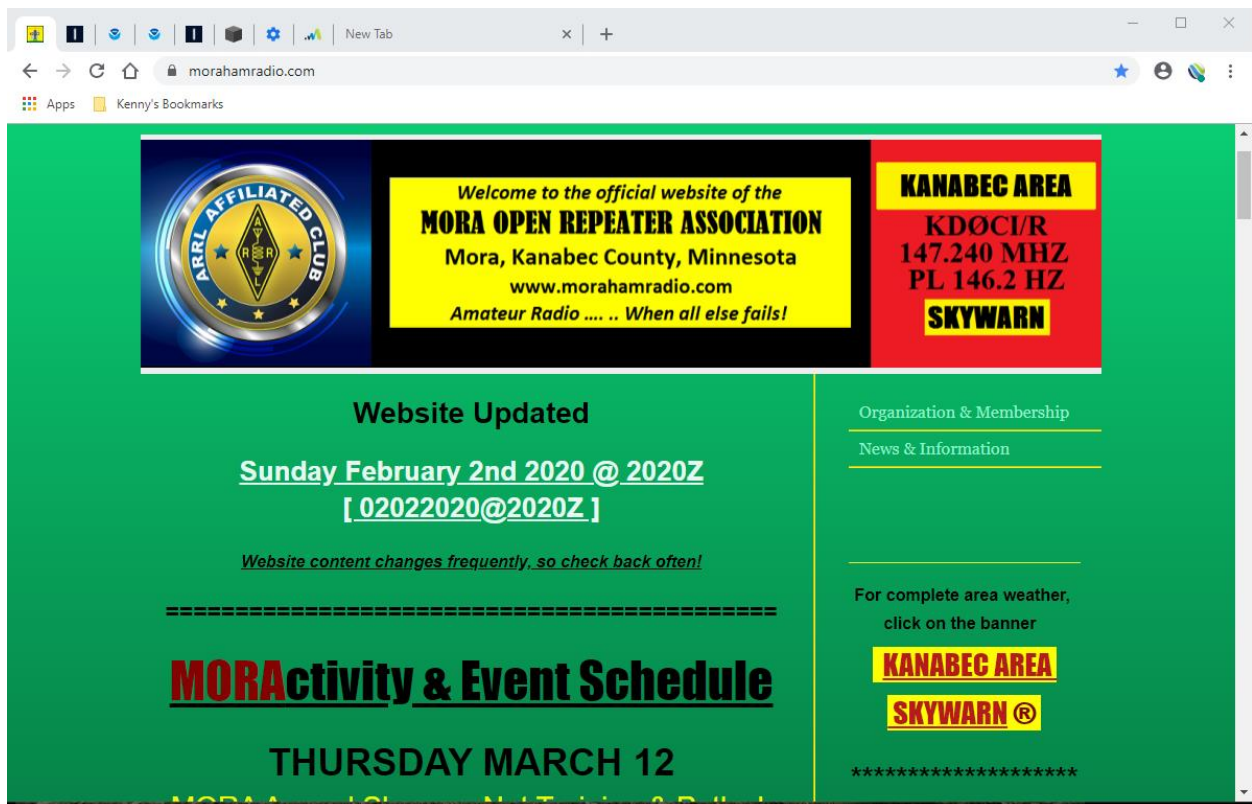
